Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival 2016 - Day 3 & 4

Event: 'Apeejay Children's Literary Festival'

Kolkata, 16th& 17thJanuary, 2016: Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival 2016 organized an activity-packed and fun filled children's literature festival curated by and presented in association with Ramanjit Kaur and The Creative Arts. This children's festival aimed at promoting, reading, creativity and critical thinking amongst the children and nurturing their artistic skills. The festival spread over a day and half witnessed participation of 5 to 16 year old students from La Martiniere For Girls and Boys, Modern High School, Calcutta International, Apeejay School, Delhi Public School and Loreto and others.

The festival was inaugurated by renowned percussionist **Tanmoy Bose** and his sons **Shiladitya** and **Shauryaditya Bose** performed a musical tribute to teachers and gurus. Featuring talks, interactive reading sessions, discussions, plays, workshops on creative writing & bookmaking, sessions on rhyming and poetry, theatre, songs and singing, the sessions were conducted by renowned personalities and eminent theatre actors like **Ramanjit Kaur, Baishali Chatterjee Dutt and Suktara Lal**.

The Festival also featured a very special book launch by well- known child specialist, **Dr. Anupam Sibal** - 'Is your Child Ready to face the World?', a book on parenting with foreword by Amitabh Bachchan. The book launch was followed by a special session by Dr. Sibal on parenting. In the book, Dr Sibal, detailed how he has used inspiring icons, world events and personal anecdotes to communicate to his own child, and mentions about the values he feels all children need, to face the world.

The Apeejay Children's Literary Festival also included theatre performance by children's group **Jhalapala** who performed the Bengali play 'Tai Se Jatoi Chhoto Hok' and reading by Australian author **Jeanne Ryckmans**, from her book 'The Two Acrobats'. The festival also showcased a unique activity by facilitator **Raju Raman** where students and teachers participated and performed extempore activity together.

The second day saw a plethora of vibrant activities ranging from teacher – student activity on folk tales, Story writing to singing songs for children and rhyming poetry. Some of the highlights of the second day were *Excerpts of Shakespeare's plays* by children of The Creative Arts, directed by Baisali Chatterjee Dutt and Shuktara Lal titled as 'All the World's a TCA Stage'. Other activities are *Sing me a Story*, where folk tales are performed in a song format - teachers and students

perform together, lullabies being sung from all over the world, mobile film on Kolkata, to be used as inspiration for story writing activity and a parent child story enactment activity as a tribute to grandparents.

AKLF highlights several unique concepts with a fresh approach that reflects current concerns such as diversity, gender equality, continuities across borders and youth engagements, which are also broad themes running through the festival. AKLF signature heritage sites include Nandan, Town Hall steps, The Indian Museum, Presidency University, Tollygunge Club and Victoria Memorial. AKLF 2016 has participation from Australia, Israel, Scotland, Italy, Nigeria, Portugal as well as England, France, Germany, Pakistan, Bhutan and others. Some of the prominent personalities who will be part of the literary extravaganza are Ben Okri, Meera Syal, Christine Manfield, Ashis Nandy, Vir Sanghvi, Bharathi S Pradhan, Shatrughan Sinha, Shobhaa De and more. The four day long, multi-faceted event has several stimulating components designed to give visitors and the audience an enriching experience, with a great blend of literature, culture, art and heritage. And all of this is absolutely free for Kolkata and her culture-loving audience.

Dr. Anupam Sibal, (MD, FIMSA, FIAP, FRCP {Glasg}, FRCP {Lon}, FRCPCH, FAAP) has been a paediatrician for twenty years, trained in India and the UK. In 1998, he helped set up the first successful paediatric liver transplant programme, the Apollo Solid Organ Transplant Program, in India at Apollo Hospitals, Delhi. Prof. Sibal has been the Group Medical Director of the Apollo Hospitals Group since 2005. Prof. Sibal is an Honorary Clinical Professor at Macquarie University, Sydney, Australia. He has more than ninety-five publications in medical literature, serves on the editorial board of three journals and has edited a text book of paediatric gastroenterology and hepatology. Prof. Sibal lives in Delhi with his wife, Nandini, and son, Devaang. 'Is your child ready

to face the world?' is his new parenting book about getting kids ready to face the world with a foreword by none other than Amitabh Backchan.

Ramanjit Kaur has been working as the lead Actor with Neelam Man Singh Chowdhry's 'The Company' for over two decades. Her performance career has taken her all over India and to Festivals worldwide. She has trained at Centre School of Speech and Drama, UK; London Academy of music and Dramatic Arts, UK; Birmingham School of Speech and Drama, UK; Improbable Theatre, UK and Theatre du Soleil, France. Her Film Credits include Deepa Mehta's 'Videsh - Heaven On Earth' and 'Fire'. In 2002, Ramanjit branched out on her own as Artistic Director of 'The Creative Arts', a company she founded with the aim of offering Theatre training and now known for exploring experimental genres such as Site-Specific Theatre. She made her directorial debut at the Lylian Baylis Studio, UK in 2008, with the play 'Crab Soup', as part of the International Theatre Science Festival. She has also conceived and directed many plays including Site-Specific productions like 'Is Job Charnock coming to dinner?', 'Upon A Yarn' and 'The Merry Go Round'. Ms. Ramanjit has won numerous Awards including Sangeet Natak Akademi Award, Sanskriti Award, French Embassy Scholarship and The Charles Wallace Award
